



# LIFESKILLS GAME

## “Alphabet Pocket Organization”

This game is a fun way to illustrate getting organized and organizing things.

### What do we need?

- Nothing

### How do we play?

1. Everyone on the team (which will be their small group) searches through their own pockets, wallets, purses, etc.
2. The group tries to come up with one possession that begins with each letter of the alphabet in order.
3. They may need to get creative to get more letters. For example: a cell phone can work for both “C” for cell and “P” for phone. But they will need 2 phones to accomplish that.
4. You cannot use the same items twice.
5. The winning team is the one to have objects representing the most letters. (Or the first group to find something to represent every letter of the alphabet.)

## GAME TIME

### “Baby Feed”

For so long students have been spoon-fed their faith. As Roots comes to an end the challenge to the students is to feed themselves. They’ve been given tools and have become self aware enough to begin to feed themselves spiritually.

#### What do we need?

- Plastic spoon (1 per small group)
- Baby food (3 jars per small group)

#### How do we play?

1. Two students from each small group will come up to the front of the room to represent their small group and compete against the other small group reps.
2. One student will stand in front of their partner with their hands on their hips.
3. The student behind the front student will stick their arms through the gap between the front person’s arms and hips. This will give the illusion that the back person’s arms are actually the front person’s arms.
4. On GO the back student will spoon from a bowl of baby food and attempt to feed their partner.
5. The team that accomplishes this task first wins.

#### Other ideas to celebrate for the last Roots:

- Build your own Sundae party (get ice cream and all the fixin’s).
- Glow party with or with out dancing. Get glow-in-the-dark items and turn off the lights.
- Have an award ceremony or graduation and hand out awards or diplomas.

## LIFESKILLS CLOSE
