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- Doubts are not the enemy or opposite of faith. Doubts, handled well, can be a doorway to a deeper faith.
- Common reasons for doubt:
 - o Enduring trauma
 - o Growing up with a rigid faith
 - Seeing hypocritical behavior from Christians
 - Having theological questions
 - Not moving from cultural or parental faith to personal faith
- Key Scriptures

Job 13:5-12 Psalm 73 Matthew 5:3

Pray: God, thank You for meeting us in our doubts and questions. We're so thankful that even when we feel uncertain in our faith, You're still with us. Please guide us and direct us as we search for answers to the questions we have. In Jesus' name, amen.
