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How to Know Where to Be Generous

- 1. Define your values.
 - What are you most passionate about?
 - If you could right one wrong in the world, what would it be?
 - What kind of legacy do you want to leave?
- 2. Do your research.
 - Websites like <u>www.ecfa.org</u> and <u>www.guidestar.org</u> give helpful insight into nonprofit organizations.
 - If you have questions about an organization, contact them!
 Many places enjoy talking about the work they do, and should be willing to connect with you.
- 3. Think about what has impacted you.
 - Consider giving to organizations or causes that have made a personal impact on you, your family, or your community so that they can continue impacting others.

Red Flags to Avoid

- 1. Trust your gut.
 - If it feels like it could be a scam, it might be.
 Remember: Research where your money is going before you make a donation.
- 2. Review financial records and reports.
 - Organizations should be transparent about how they use their resources and who they are accountable to.
- 3. Know the leader's character.
 - The leader sets the tone for the organization, so consider their experience and reputation.
