What To Do First

Review

- 1. **Introduce** yourself.
- 2. **Say** the **Question**, **Answer**, and **Verse** together.

Read

- 1. **Lay** Story Cards in order.
- 2. **Point** to the first card.
- 3. **Read** the caption.
- 4. **Ask** the **Question**. *Kids answer.*
- 5. **Do Action** together.
- 6. **Repeat** steps 2-5 for Story Cards 2-5.

Remember Now What?

- 1. **Show** Story Card 1.
- 2. **Read** the caption.
- 3. **Ask**, "Now what's going to happen in the next picture?" *Kids answer*.
- 4. **Repeat** steps 1-3 for Story Cards 2-5.

Action

Put on a crown to show Jesus is King of everything.

Question

Who put a thorny crown on Jesus and nailed Him to the cross. *The soldiers*

Action

Touch your hands and feet and remember how much Jesus loves you.

Story

3

Card

Question
There did Joseph

Where did Joseph put Jesus' body? *In a tomb*

Action

It was sad when Jesus died. Make a sad face.

4

Question

Who looked in the tomb? *The women*

Action

Clap and cheer to celebrate!

Card 5

Question

What did Jesus do to forgive us? He died for our sin and lives again.

Action

Whisper, "Jesus loves you," into a friend's ear.

How To Wrap Up

Talk

What kind of crown would you wear if you were a king or a queen?

Pray

Ask kids what they want to talk to God about, and pray with them.

Check Out TimeBegin When Parents Arrive

- 1. **Combine** your Small Groups if you need to free up a leader.
- 2. One leader **stands** at the door to **greet** parents and **run** check out.
- When a kid leaves, tell the parents something positive about their kid.
- 4. **Encourage** parents to take a picture of the Parent Convo card.
