Small Group Icebreaker (5 min.)

- **Introduce** yourself. **Welcome** students by name. **Check in** with them to see how they're doing.
- Icebreaker: **If you had to get an A on a quiz, which subject or topic would you hope it'd be about?**

Welcome (30 sec.)

- Welcome everyone and say our three simple Loop rules: **Respect your leaders. Respect each other. Respect the room.**
- Invite everyone to stand for worship.

Transition to Episode (30 sec.)

- Get students excited for this week's episode of *The Loop Show!*
It's time for The Loop Show! We're learning all about following Jesus into whatever adventure He leads us into. What wackiness will Ricky and Jayme get into to teach us about that? Let's watch!

Offering and Announcements (2 min.)

- **Recap** teaching in one sentence.
- **Celebrate** hands raised during the salvation video.
- **Show** the spot where students can give their tithes and offerings.
- **Pray** for tithes and offerings.
- **Say:** Have you subscribed to **The Loop Show on YouTube** yet? You can watch your favorite episodes anytime and check out bonus content you won't find here in Loop on the weekend. Ask your parents if you can subscribe today!
- **Transition** to Activity.

Activity (10 min.)

Game Objective

Stand by the wall that represents what you believe to be the correct answer to the multiple-choice question given.

How to Play

Say: Today, we watched Ricky and Jayme participate in Quizman's Quiz University. So, let's play a little Quiz U right now using actual questions from Quizman's YouTube playlist from *The Loop Show!*

1. Students **stand** in the center of your room.

Say: I'll ask you one of Quizman's multiple-choice questions.

If you think the answer is A, walk to this wall.
(Point to a wall in your room.)

If you think it's B, walk to that wall.
(Point to the next wall in a clockwise pattern.)

If you think it's C, walk to that wall.
(Point to the next wall in a clockwise pattern.)

And if you think it's D, walk to the last remaining wall.
(Point to the last wall following the same pattern.)

2. **Repeatedly point to** walls A, B, C, and D a few times, making sure all students know them well.
3. **Read** a question from the Quizman University Activity Supplement printed on back.
4. **Point** to appropriate walls as you offer the multiple choices.
5. **Students walk** to the wall that represents their answer.
6. **Reveal** the correct answer and **celebrate** with any winners.
7. **Reset** and ask more questions from Quizman University as time allows.

Ideas for Variations and Accommodations

- If a student knows a cool piece of trivia, they can ask their own question. (Have them run it by you first.)
- Students/leaders can write a question about themselves. Example: I have a pet A: lizard, B: turtle, C: monkey, or D: tree frog
- Students with mobility limitations could say their answer instead of moving to the wall.

Review Today's Bible Verse

- **Locate Bibles** in the room, **look up** the verse together, and **talk about** what's the same and what's different if it's in a different translation.

Romans 8:37-39 NIRV ... *We owe it all to Christ, who has loved us. I am absolutely sure that not even death or life can separate us from God's love. Not even angels or demons, the present or the future, or any powers can separate us. Not even the highest places or the lowest, or anything else in all creation can separate us. Nothing at all can ever separate us from God's love. That's because of what Christ Jesus our Lord has done.*

- What's one word or phrase from this verse that's especially meaningful to you?

More Questions to Keep Your Group Talking

- What stood out to you the most from today's *Loop Show*? What's one thing you learned?
- What do you think it means when someone calls following Jesus an adventure?
- Why do you think Jesus asks people to follow Him?
- What do you think is hard about following Jesus and what do you think is easy about it?
- Who can you go to when you have questions about Jesus?

Pray Together

Check in with your group. How are they doing? Anything they want to ask or thank God for? Pray together!

Leader Tip

Want your Loopsters to sing out and really worship God with their whole hearts during worship time? Lead by example! You don't have to sing well, just sing out. Your students will feel much freer to join in if they're not alone. Encourage them by telling them how great they sound, and never let them worship God alone.
